

PHASE 4 OF THE RESUMPTION OF ACTIVITIES APPROVAL

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On September 26, 2020, through the Supreme Decree N° 157-2020-PCM, the Peruvian State has approved the Phase 4 of the Resumption of Economic Activities, which represents the last phase foreseen for the economic reactivation of the country within the framework of the COVID-19 pandemic.

PHASE 4 ECONOMIC ACTIVITIES

Phase 4 enables the resumption of the following activities:

START DATE FOR RESUMPTION OF ACTIVITIES

The implementation of the Phase 4 of the Resumption of Activities began as of the effective date of Supreme Decree N° 157-2020-PCM, that is, as of October 1, 2020.

This is with the exception of air transport activities, such as international flights to health destinations, which were enabled to resume activities from October 5, 2020.

MANDATORY COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS

In accordance with the provisions of Supreme Decree N° 117-2020-PCM, for the purpose of the resumption of activities, the "Guidelines for the Surveillance, Prevention and Control of the Health of Workers at Risk of Exposure to COVID-19", regulated by Ministerial Resolution N° 448-2020-MINSA, as well as with the Sectoral Protocols that may be issued, must be complied with.

In addition, the "Plan for the Surveillance, Prevention and Control of COVID-19 at the Work Center" prepared in accordance with the above-mentioned provisions, must be registered before the Ministry of Health.

RESUMPTION OF ACTIVITIES IN FOCUSED QUARANTINE ZONES

Areas that are in Focused Quarantine will not be able to start with Phase 4 of the Resumption of Activities. The resumption will be authorized gradually through the appropriate Ministries.

In this regard, it is worth mentioning that according to Supreme Decree N° 156-2020-PCM, the following provinces are in Focused Quarantine:

Notwithstanding the aforementioned, the following activities have been authorized to resume in the above-mentioned provinces:

RESUMPTION OF ADDITIONAL ACTIVITIES

The regulation under commentary has provided that activities not contemplated in any of the Phases of economic reactivation will be progressively enabled, through the issuance of new regulations.

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
